This means we, at All Saints Clifton, have formally signed up to the shared vision:

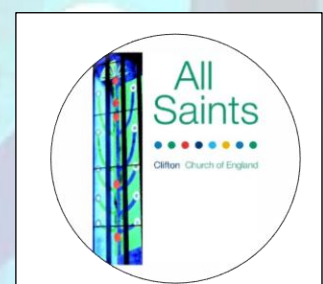

Proceeds will go to this year's Christmas Charity.

2	<p>Mass 9.30am Today is the International Day for the Abolition of Slavery. Pray for those whose lives have been blighted by involvement in the modern day slave trade. Pray for charities like Stop the Traffik and other advocates working for victims and for their freedom; for the perpetrators of associated crimes and for the police and justice system working in response.</p>
3	<p>Mass 9.30am Pray for those organisations, churches and individuals planning and preparing to open hostels, food banks and Christmas Day lunch provision over the Christmas period. Pray that a sense of collective responsibility and generosity amongst communities to care for their more vulnerable members will be evident.</p>
4	<p>Mass 9.30am Pray for the NHS and for hospital A&E departments facing extra pressure as the winter progresses: for nursing staff and managers whose job it is to prioritise under pressure in order to help the most vulnerable.</p>
5	<p>Mass 7.00pm As this Advent season of waiting begins, pray for those who are 'waiting' today, for whatever reason: for vital news, for letters, for decisions, for a home, for progress, for loved ones. Pray that they may know patience and peace as they wait.</p>
6	<p>Mass 10.30am Nicholas, Bishop of Myra, c.326. Today is the feast of St. Nicholas. As we remember this feast day, may we not lose sight-beneath the folk tale- of the qualities of faithfulness, goodness and love, demonstrated by Saint Nicholas to his people. May we pray for those same qualities to be evident in our own lives.</p>
7	<p>Mass 10.30am Ambrose of Milan, Teacher of the Faith 397A gifted liturgist and theologian, Ambrose is traditionally credited with the antiphonal chant. He became bishop of Milan in 374 and was a particular influence on Augustine. Give thanks for those who have influenced our traditions of liturgy and theology with their insight and understanding.</p> <p>Concert Matinée 4.00pm</p>
8	<p>Advent 2 The Conception of The Blessed Virgin Mary. Lord Jesus, light of the world, blessed is Gabriel who brought good news; blessed is Mary, your mother and ours.
