## YOU:

- Ensure your child is in school REGULARLY, ON TIME & PREPARED
- Let the office know via ParentMail (or phone/email)
   asap if your child is ill: if they are up & about at
   home, they should be in school (except diarrhoea &
   vomiting = 48 hours before returning)
- . Bring your child to the office if your child is late
- Arrange holidays and trips <u>outside</u> school hours, including medical & other appointments where possible
- Request any unavoidable absence at least 4
   weeks in advance via the online form—the link is
   on the website and in the weekly bulletin

## WE:

- Meet and greet your child with a have a learning activity ready immediately, record attendance on the register & lock the gate 5 minutes after the bell
- Record absence / lateness on the register with the right code & if we haven't heard from you we will ring you to make sure your child is safe & ask about the absence
- Review your request and let you know the outcome via email. Only exceptional / unavoidable absence are likely to be authorised. We cannot stop you taking your child out of school, but 8 half days or more unauthorised absence in a 10 week period may incur a fixed penalty (fine), especially for holidays.
- Track & monitor the attendance & lateness of all children
- Will tell you your child's attendance and punctuality 3x a year.
- Will get in touch when we are concerned about your child's the attendance or lateness so we can <u>support</u> you to help them be in school.

Registers close ½ hour after the bell - arriving after this time results in an unauthorised absence

An average of 90% attendance over 5 years = half a year's schooling missed

## **If We Are Concerned**

STEP 1: Contact from the teacher to discuss the impact

STEP 2: Meet the teacher to explore further & offer help

2 weeks of monitoring for improvement

STEP 3: Acknowledge improvement



STEP 3: Meet the deputy to discuss further support Agree an action plan

(May be strategies, wellbeing support, asking to contact GP, access to services etc.)

STEP 4: If concerns persist, we will take formal action

(May be a parenting contract, fixed penalty, Education Supervision Order or prosecution)
